Divine Appointment in Physical Crisis

John 4:43-54 | Jun 14, 2026



John 4:1-10 ESV - ⁴³ After the two days he departed for Galilee. ⁴⁴ (For Jesus himself had testified that a prophet has no honor in his own hometown.) ⁴⁵ So when he came to Galilee, the Galileans welcomed him, having seen all that he had done in Jerusalem at the feast. For they too had gone to the feast.

⁴⁶ So he came again to Cana in Galilee, where he had made the water wine. And at Capernaum there was an official whose son was ill. ⁴⁷ When this man heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went to him and asked him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. ⁴⁸ So Jesus said to him, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe." ⁴⁹ The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my child dies." ⁵⁰ Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and went on his way. ⁵¹ As he was going down, his servants met him and told him that his son was recovering. ⁵² So he asked them the hour when he began to get better, and they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him." ⁵³ The father knew that was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." And he himself believed, and all his household. ⁵⁴ This was now the second sign that Jesus did when he had come from Judea to Galilee.

OBSERVATION | *What does the text say?*

1. What was the condition of the royal official's son and what action did the father take when he heard Jesus was in Cana (John 4:46-47)?

2. How did Jesus respond to the official's request and what concern did He raise about signs and wonders (John 4:48)?

3. What specific promise did Jesus give the official in John 4:50?

4. What evidence did the servants provide that confirmed Jesus' word (John 4:51-53)?

5. What was the final result of this miracle in the life of the official and his household (vv. 53-54)?

INTERPRETATION | *What does the text mean?*

1. Why do you think John emphasizes that the Galileans welcomed Jesus because they had seen His miracles (John 4:45)?

What is the difference between being impressed by Jesus and truly believing in Him?
