Warm greetings from Kawasaki. Really warm! In August, Japan serves up all the heat + twice the humidity. (You can fry and egg on the sidewalk and hardboil it at same time.)

10,000 Reasons

As you know, we like to get you involved in our church planting work here in practical, bite-sized wavs.

The Numbers

We estimate that there are 10,000 households with elementary school age (grades 1~6) children within a 10-minute WALK of our chapel. A guess, but based on number of (local elementary schools x classes x avg class size) + avg family size.

What We'll Do

On Aug 21~23 (Wed~Fri), we will do a 3day Kids English Camp, with two separate age groups a day for K~grade 3 (plus a few younger ones). This is a preevangelism, community felt needs outreach. It functions to make people aware of our chapel existence, our location, our heart for the neighborhood, and to get the connection going with us. It also serves as a kickoff to upcoming, ongoing fall kids ministry.

Kevin has all kinds of ideas and will teach the classes (until he falls over), with a theme around a kids storybook that is extremely popular in Japan. Meanwhile, Kaori manages the communication and organization side of things (turns out we're a good team).
